## A Legacy of Mentorship

Looking back at Nepal's entrepreneurial journey over the past decade, one theme stands out: the quiet, transformative power of mentorship. Long before Briddhi existed, I had the privilege of working with PUM Netherlands Senior Experts, one of the world's most respected volunteer-mentorship networks. As PUM's local representative in Nepal, I witnessed firsthand how experienced professionals - whether at the peak of their careers or even post-retirement - traveled across continents simply to share their knowledge with entrepreneurs they had never met.

What struck me most was the purity of intent. There were no incentives, no transactions, no conditions, just a deep belief that entrepreneurs everywhere deserve guidance and that expertise, when freely shared, becomes a catalyst for meaningful change.

During my years with PUM, I saw factories modernize, family businesses evolve, and small enterprises take leaps forward, all because someone cared enough to mentor them. Those experiences stayed with me, teaching me that mentorship is not just advice; it is the transfer of wisdom, confidence, and belief from one generation of builders to the next.

As Nepal's startup ecosystem began to grow, it became clear we needed something similar here: a local model inspired by PUM's spirit, led by Nepali business leaders for Nepali entrepreneurs. That seed of an idea eventually grew into Briddhi. Our platform brings together senior business leaders who have built companies, navigated crises, and shaped industries in Nepal - people who know our markets, understand our challenges, and share a deep connection with this country.

Today, Briddhi stands as a testament to that belief. CEOs, founders, and seasoned professionals volunteer their time - sometimes 15 days, sometimes much more - not for recognition but because they understand the challenges of entrepreneurship and the transformative impact of timely guidance.

Briddhi's journey is still young but its foundation rests on decades of global mentorship legacy and local passion. My experiences with PUM showed me what is possible when knowledge is shared generously. Briddhi is our effort to carry that legacy forward: to build a culture where successful leaders uplift the next generation and where mentorship becomes a defining pillar of Nepal's entrepreneurship ecosystem.

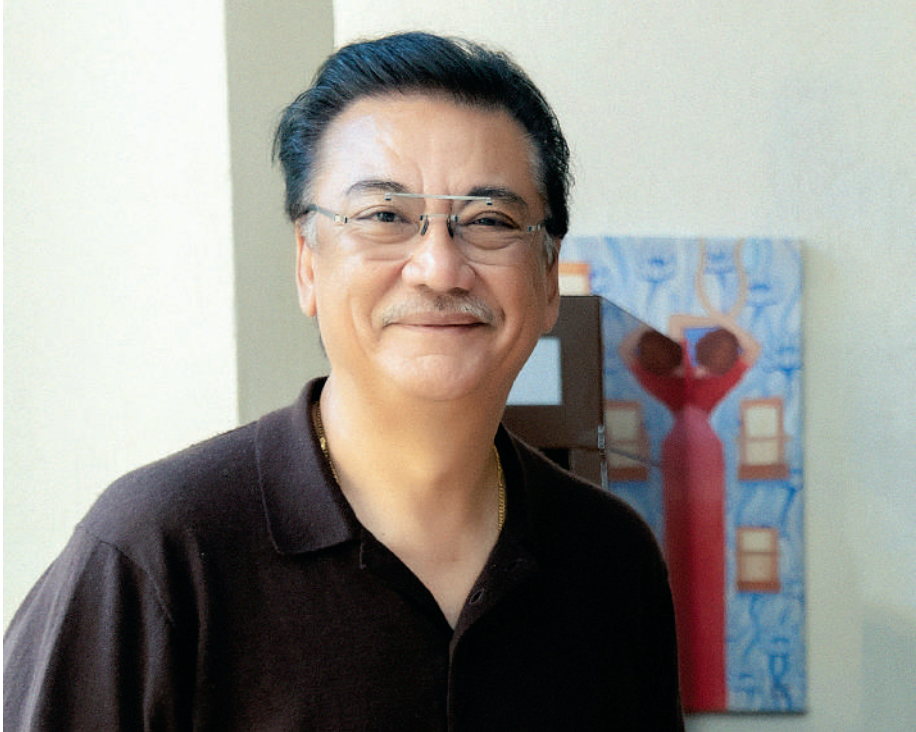

# THE BRIDDHI MODEL

## where experience meets impact

At its core, Briddhi is a structured, volunteer-driven mentorship program designed to make the act of giving back both meaningful and effortless. It is Nepal's first ever platform that institutionalizes the culture of volunteer mentorship. It acts as an exclusive platform of volunteer mentors who are firm believers in giving back to society and voluntarily coming together for the growth of Nepali enterprises, with a focus on sustainable development and high impact. It envisions cultivating a thriving entrepreneurial ecosystem, where young, aspiring business leaders are equipped with the skills, knowledge, and resources they need to thrive. Its mission is to create lasting impact by providing mentorship and guidance to enterprises and organizations seeking support in improving their business performance and help them create their niche ecosystem that inspires creativity and resilience.

Briddhi recognizes that senior business leaders lead busy lives, and yet, so many are willing to contribute if a clear, well-organized platform enables them to do so. Briddhi exists to provide that structure for volunteer mentors.

Briddhi defines mentors as professionals with valuable expertise, skills, and networks in their respective fields. They volunteer to mentor enterprises, motivated by a strong

desire to give back to society. Depending on their mentees' needs, mentors assume diverse roles, including those of experts, trainers, advisors, facilitators, mediators, guardians, and companions.

As a mentor, Briddhi envisions a mentor taking on one of the three key roles during their mentorship session with their mentee, based on their interests and expertise.

**As a trainer:** Mentors are expected to play the role of trainer in their specific area of expertise or essential business skills (Traveling is optional),

**As a domain expert:** This position requires Mentors to share their in-depth knowledge and insights in your specialized field. (Traveling is expected),

**As an advisor:** As an advisor, mentors will provide guidance on broader business matters, leveraging their experience to help others navigate various challenges. Travel is optional, granting mentors the choice of how best to connect with those seeking advice (where traveling is optional).

**Note:** Briddhi does not use the term "coach" to refer to its mentor, to avoid possible confusion. For Briddhi, coaches refer to professional business coaches who are usually paid consultants.

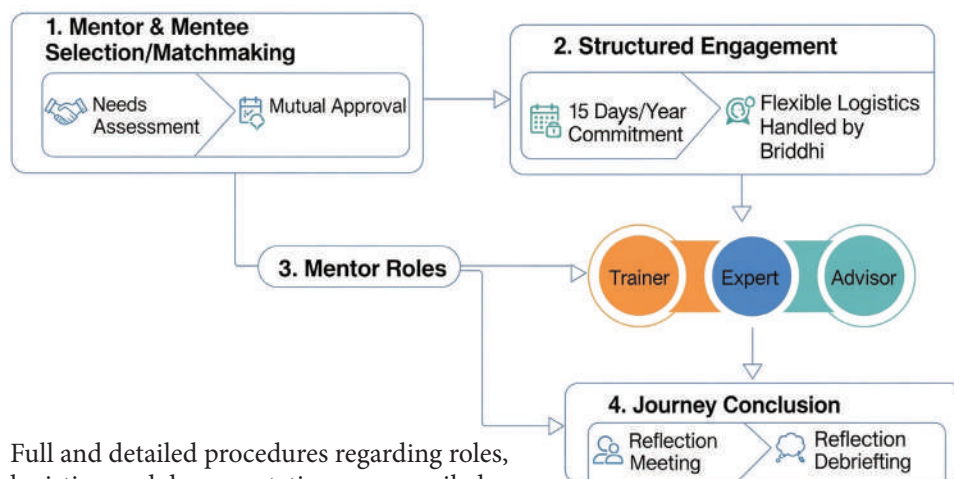
## Targeted Mentees

Briddhi supports established Startups, SMEs, or High Growth enterprises that are privately owned and typically demonstrate a minimum of two years in operation, over 10 employees, and an annual revenue of at least 50 lakh NPR. The main criteria is a minimum commitment of 6 months to the mentorship period.

## How Matchmaking Works

Entrepreneurs approach Briddhi with very specific needs. They often require strategic guidance, operations improvement, market insights, financial structuring, leadership support, and more. Our role is to understand these needs deeply and identify the mentor whose experience best fits the entrepreneur's challenge. Sometimes one mentor is sufficient; sometimes multiple mentors may

## Joining the Mentorship Pool

Becoming a Briddhi mentor begins with a simple step: signing up for our mentorship pool. This is an open invitation to experienced professionals: CEOs, founders, functional experts, industry veterans who want to share what they have learned. Once registered, mentors become part of a curated group of leaders who may be matched with entrepreneurs based on their expertise, background, and sector alignment.

be paired with a company over time. The goal is always the same: the right expertise, at the right moment, for the right entrepreneur.

Briddhi follows a volunteering model inspired by global best practices, adapted to Nepal's realities. Mentors commit to contributing 15 days per year. This engagement is designed to be flexible, distributed, and manageable. These 15 days can be spent working with a single entrepreneur or several, depending on each mentor's availability and preference. Sessions can be virtual, in-person, or hybrid, and structured in ways that feel natural to the mentor while still delivering value to the entrepreneur.





## Briddhi Handles the Logistics, So Mentors Can Focus on What Matters

Behind every mentorship relationship is a series of processes that keep things smooth and professional. Briddhi takes care of all of it.

### Our team handles:

- onboarding and documentation
- scoping sessions with entrepreneurs
- scheduling and coordination
- progress tracking and follow-ups
- final reporting and feedbacks

This means mentors can focus on sharing their insights without worrying about the operational details. For entrepreneurs, it means every mentorship engagement is properly guided, monitored, and supported to ensure meaningful outcomes.

## A Platform Built on Trust and Purpose

Briddhi's mentorship platform is not transactional, it is relational. It is a space where experienced leaders come forward because they care, and where entrepreneurs engage because they trust the value of wisdom shared across generations. Through structured match-making, organized support, and a focus on community building, Briddhi ensures that mentorship becomes a transformative experience for both sides.

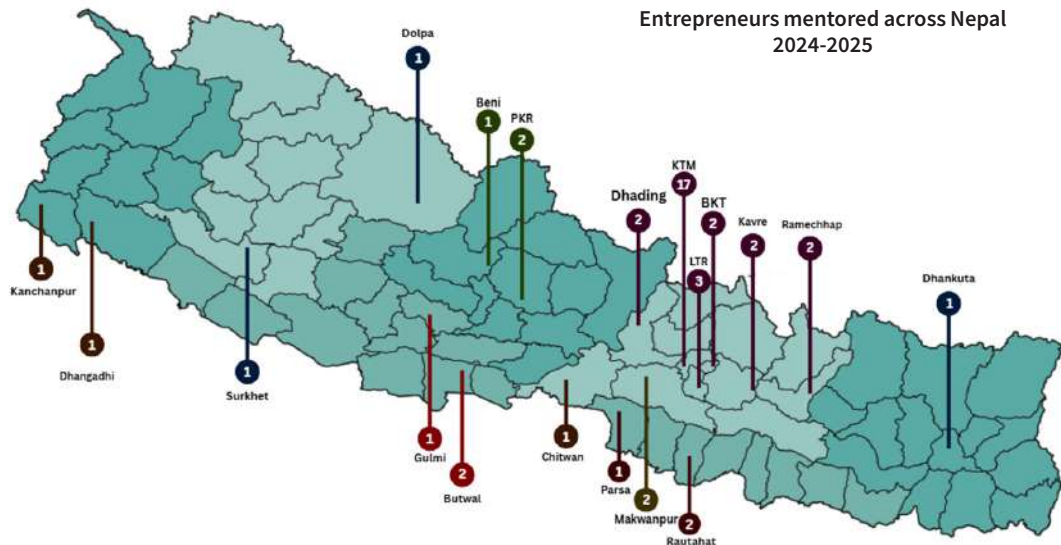
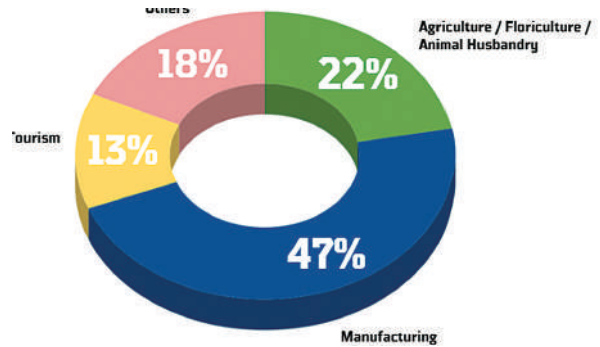

# SAKAL BIOENZYME NEPAL POWERED BY PURPOSE



*Some businesses are born from opportunity.  
Others are born from loss.  
Sakal BioEnzyme Nepal belongs to the second kind.*

Founded in 2024, this women-led social enterprise did not emerge from boardrooms or market forecasts, but from lived experience - grief, questions about health, and a quiet determination to protect others from the harm that often hides in plain sight. At its heart are Dr. Namita Maharjan, Sujata Shrestha, and Sarala Maharjan, three women who chose to turn the pain of cancer into collective purpose.

Their belief was simple, yet powerful: what we use every day should not slowly make us sick, nor poison the planet we depend on.

A personal loss to cancer compelled the founders to look closer at the everyday chemicals we accept without question - cleaners, disinfectants and household products that promise hygiene but leave behind invisible toxins. Instead of surrendering to fear, they searched for alternatives rooted in nature itself.

That search led them to bio enzymes - living, ferment-based solutions derived from organic waste like fruits, flowers and herbs. Nature, they realized, already knew how to clean, heal and regenerate. It simply needed to be trusted.





Sakal BioEnzyme's products - surface cleaners, floor cleaners, dishwashing liquids, hand washes, and mosquito repellents - are formulated using live microorganisms that break down grease, dirt and odor naturally. They are biodegradable, non-toxic and safe for homes, waterways, and the people who use them.

What makes the model even more meaningful is its circular approach: organic waste is transformed into value, reducing landfill pressure while creating affordable, sustainable alternatives.

In a market dominated by chemical brands, choosing nature was not the easy path but it was the right one. The early days were not without doubt. Many questioned whether bio enzymes could truly match the strength of chemical cleaners. Scaling fermentation processes and securing consistent raw materials posed their own challenges.

But Sakal BioEnzyme responded with patience and proof - community demonstrations, open conversations, and relentless refinement. Slowly, trust grew. What once felt unfamiliar began to feel necessary.

Sakal BioEnzyme's impact extends far beyond its products. The enterprise creates meaningful employment for single women and cancer survivors, offering skills training, income stability and dignity.

For the founders, empowerment is not a side goal, it is the foundation. In supporting women who have faced exclusion or illness, Sakal BioEnzyme reminds us that healing is not only environmental, it is human.

In early 2025, Sakal BioEnzyme reached a critical milestone by joining the Nature-Based Solutions (NbS) Innovative Challenge - Cohort I. Selected among the Top 10 winners, the enterprise received a seed grant of Rs 100,000, along with structured incubation support.

Mentorship became transformative. Financial guidance from Manik Balami strengthened long-term sustainability, while business mentorship from Reetal Rana, Managing Director of Mid-Valley International College, sharpened strategic focus and growth pathways.

Across nine hours of intensive mentorship, Sakal BioEnzyme gained market exposure, showcased products at the Saturday Le Sherpa Market, and connected with organic certification experts, including Dr. Saurabh Arora from India.

For the founders, it was more than guidance, it was validation.

Guided by mentorship, Sakal BioEnzyme expanded into partnerships with organic farms and eco-conscious hospitality businesses, including Prakriti Resort and Organic Farm. These collaborations demonstrated that nature-based products could meet both household and institutional standards.

The incubation journey also culminated in the launch of Sakal BioEnzyme's mosquito repellent at the NbS program's closing event, an innovation shaped by vision, mentorship, and persistence.

Today, Sakal BioEnzyme stands at the threshold of expansion. The founders envision bio enzyme solutions reaching every corner of Nepal, extending beyond household cleaning into agriculture and industrial applications.

But their deeper ambition goes beyond scale. They hope to change habits.

To raise awareness. To remind people that sustainable choices are not sacrifices, they are acts of care. Because when we choose nature, we choose health. When we empower women, we strengthen communities. And when purpose guides innovation, impact follows.



# Building an Ecosystem Where Entrepreneurs Can Thrive



Nepal's development journey increasingly depends on the strength and resilience of its entrepreneurs. Across sectors and regions, entrepreneurs are solving local problems, creating employment and introducing innovations that respond to Nepal's unique social, economic and environmental realities. For this potential to be fully realized, however, we must build an ecosystem that goes beyond access to finance and policy incentives; one that actively supports entrepreneurs through every stage of their journey.

The Government of Nepal has taken important steps in this direction, including the rollout of startup loan facilities designed to improve access to capital for early-stage and growth-oriented enterprises. These initiatives signal a clear commitment to fostering entrepreneurship as a driver of inclusive economic growth. Yet, experience has shown us that finance alone does not guarantee success. Without the right guidance, networks and decision-making support, even well-funded startups can struggle to sustain and scale.



This is where mentorship and ecosystem partnerships become indispensable. From a government and development perspective, mentorship is one of the most underutilized yet powerful tools available to us. Entrepreneurs often fail not due to lack of ideas or effort, but due to the absence of trusted advice at critical moments, when navigating regulatory pathways, refining business models, or responding to market shocks.

Institutions like the Industrial Enterprise Development Institute (IEDI) recognize this reality. Our deep partnership with ICIMOD, Briddhi and KGS Inc. reflects a shared belief that entrepreneurship support must be holistic. Programs such as the Nature-based Solutions (NbS) Innovation Challenge demonstrate how public institutions and private ecosystem enablers can work together combining policy intent, programmatic resources, mentorship, and market-oriented thinking to support entrepreneurs addressing climate, sustainability, and livelihood challenges.

The future before us presents two very different possibilities. In a hopeful future, strong partnerships continue to evolve, startup loans are complemented by mentorship, entrepreneurs are guided rather than left to navigate complexity alone, and innovation-led enterprises emerge as engines of green and inclusive growth. In such a scenario, entrepreneurship becomes a viable and respected pathway for Nepal's youth, contributing directly to economic resilience and national prosperity.



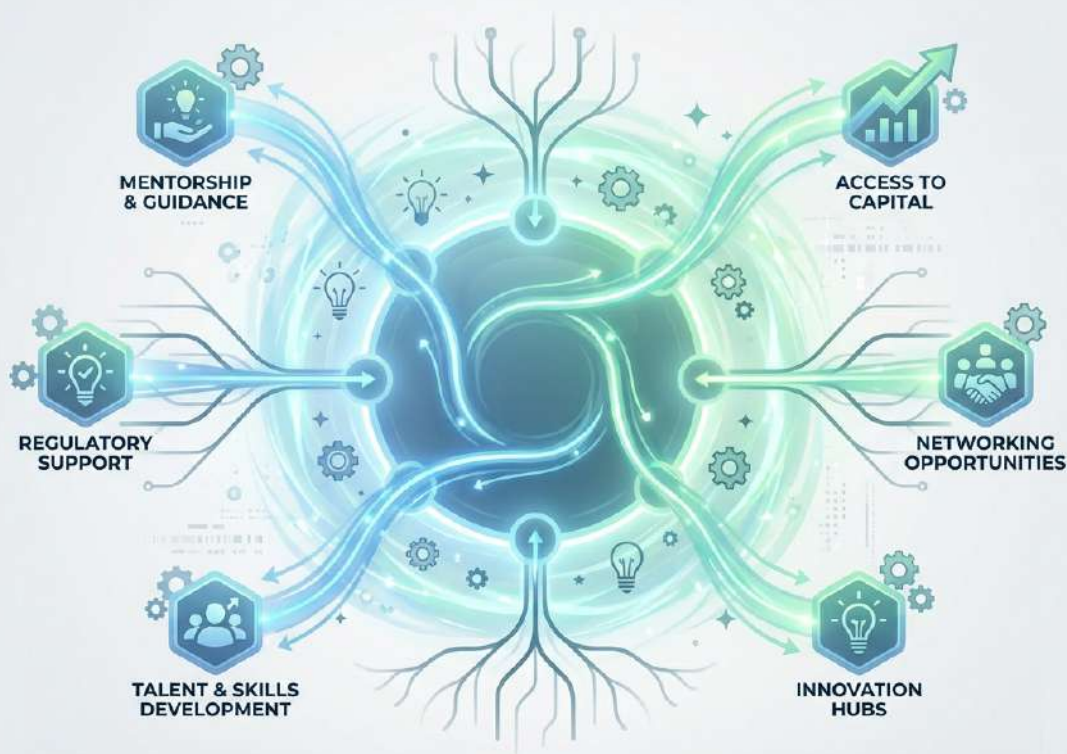

The pessimistic alternative is equally clear. Without coordinated ecosystem support, financial instruments risk becoming transactional, promising ventures may fail prematurely and public trust in entrepreneurship-led development may erode. Fragmented efforts, operating in silos, could limit impact at a time when Nepal can least afford lost opportunities.

The choice, therefore, lies in how we collaborate. Platforms like Briddhi exemplify the connective role the ecosystem urgently needs; linking government commitment, institutional support and the lived experience of seasoned professionals. By strengthening these partnerships, we can ensure that entrepreneurship in Nepal is not left to chance but is nurtured with intention, responsibility and hope.



# Strengthening Entrepreneurial Ecosystems Through Mentorship and Partnership



Across the Hindu Kush Himalayan region, one truth is becoming increasingly clear: strong entrepreneurial ecosystems are built not only on capital, infrastructure or policy, but on people - on the willingness of experienced leaders to

guide, support and stand alongside those just beginning their journey. From ICIMOD's perspective, this human dimension of ecosystem-building is both powerful and often undervalued.



Our partnership with Briddhi is rooted in this understanding. Briddhi represents a model of ecosystem support that places mentorship at its core; mobilizing senior professionals and business leaders to voluntarily share their experience with young and emerging entrepreneurs. This approach aligns closely with ICIMOD's belief that sustainable development outcomes are best achieved when knowledge flows freely across generations, sectors and institutions.

Within the NbS Innovation Challenge, this mentorship-driven model is being implemented through a strong institutional collaboration: IEDI as the lead agency, KGS Inc. as the technical partner and Briddhi as the mentorship partner. Together, we are supporting three cohorts of entrepreneurs by the end of 2026. While the thematic focus of the program provides an important context, what truly distinguishes this initiative is the way mentorship is embedded as a structural pillar rather than a peripheral activity.

Briddhi's contribution demonstrates how volunteer mentors can significantly enhance the effectiveness of formal programs. By offering strategic guidance, lived experience and honest reflection, mentors help entrepreneurs navigate uncertainty, strengthen decision-making and build confidence. In doing so, mentorship transforms programs from transactional interventions into meaningful growth journeys.

Looking ahead, the priority is consolidation and replication. The value of the Briddhi model lies in its



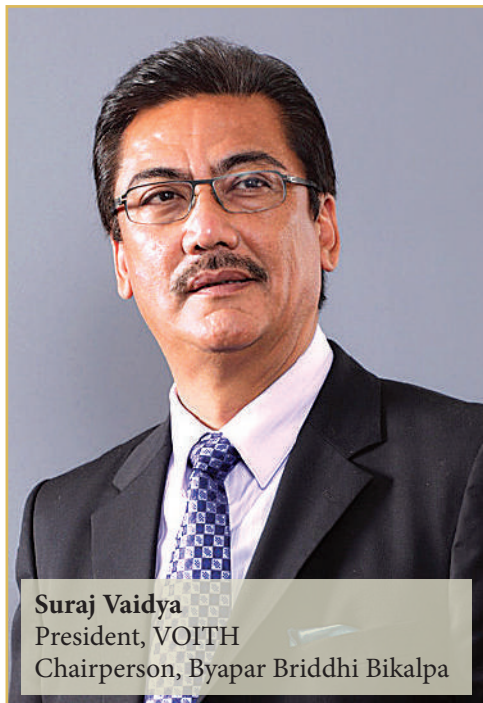

simplicity and transferability: a clear structure for mobilizing volunteer mentors, strong alignment with institutional programs, and a shared culture of giving back. Platforms such as the GIREE Alliance offer a practical pathway to adapt and extend this approach across the region connecting ecosystem institutions, senior leaders, and entrepreneurs within and beyond national boundaries.

For ICIMOD, this partnership highlights an important direction for ecosystem development. When mentorship is intentionally integrated into programs and supported through credible partnerships, it strengthens not only individual entrepreneurs but the ecosystem as a whole. The Briddhi model offers a compelling reference point for how experience, commitment and collaboration can be organized to support entrepreneurship at scale: locally, nationally and regionally.



KGS Inc., Briddhi, and Antarprerana come together as a unified consortium with a shared vision to reimagine how entrepreneurship is built and sustained. Working as one integrated team, the consortium designs strong incubation systems, cultivates mentorship capital, and unlocks pathways to finance - bridging ideas to institutions, founders to guidance, and innovation to investment. By operating seamlessly across incubation, mentorship, and capital, the consortium nurtures resilient, purpose-driven, and scalable ventures, while strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystems that enable innovation, inclusion, and long-term economic transformation.
